Homework and home projects will be given to children every two weeks.

Please see below an overview of the main themes, knowledge and skills we will be covering this half term.

Enquiry Question	Do you have a favourite story? Once upon a time (Sparkle and shine)
Significant People	Jean Loo – Director of Superhero Me
Class Texts	We're going on a leaf hunt, The 3 billy goats gruff, The Gingerbread Man  Velocity First Favourite tales  We're Going on a Gruff Goats Gru
Literacy	The children will be learning Phase 1 phonics—Rhyming words and Action songs.  Reading favourite stories. Can we talk about what is happening in the pictures?  Filling in missing words from a rhyme  Learning the names of different parts of a book (Front cover, back cover, pages)

Counting from 1.5 in soquence
Counting from 1-5, in sequence
Size (Big/medium and small objects)
Counting out objects from 1 to 5
Sorting leaves by colour, size and shape
Talking about 2D shapes (circle, triangle, square and rectangle)
Clapping out rhymes and joining in with actions
Talking about different experience and celebrations
Using past and present tenses (I played with my toy)
Begin to understand "why" questions (Why were the goats scared ?)
Discussing what the children have made, using longer sentences
Recall some parts of a familiar story
Joining in with songs and rhymes
Colour recognition (Learning colour names)
Mood paintings (happy, sad)
Leaf paintings, using leaves and different coloured paints
Colour mixing (What will happen if we mix red and yellow together?)

Understanding of the World	Playing with small world models/Building models
	Discussing different home experiences and celebrations (Diwali/Christmas)
	Bark/Leaf rubbings
	Making gingerbread men
	Talking about our family members
Physical Development	Kick/catch a large ball
	Running safely within the outdoor environment
	Begin to show preference for a dominant hand
	Join in with games (Musical statues)
