The children will learn new vocabulary through a range of fiction and nonfiction books. Throughout the day we will encourage the children to answer how and why questions (Why was Bernard the robot feeling sad ?) Talking about travelling on a train **Expressive Arts** Using imagination to create pictures and Design (Drawing and painting pictures of transport and robots) The children will have the opportunity to make role play masks and engage in role play, using puppets. Each child will

	make a model of different types of transport. We will explore using instruments with increasing control to express feelings and ideas.
Understanding of the World	Talking about own experiences and celebrations (Diwali and Christmas)
