Literacy	 Writing words linked to a story/interests. Phase 2 and Phase 3 phonics. Joining in with songs and rhymes (Let's do the robot dance). Learning harder to read and spell words Drawing pictures and describing what we have drawn (e.g. It is red). Labelling characters from the stories (Robot, car, man).
Maths	·Order and compare numbers.

- Learning about repeated patterns.
- More and less within numbers to 8.
- Learning about capacity and length.

Communication and Language

We encourage the children to listen to stories and recall parts of a story (What is happening at the beginning, middle, end of the story?).

The children will learn new vocabulary through a range of fiction and non-fiction books. Throughout the day we will encourage the children to answer how and why questions (Why was Bernard the robot feeling sad?).

Talking about travelling on a train.

Expressive Arts and Design

Using imagination to create pictures (Drawing and painting pictures of transport and robots).

The children will have the opportunity to make role play masks and engage in role play, using puppets. Each child will make a model of different types of transport. We will explore using instruments with increasing control to express feelings and ideas.

Understanding of the World	Talking about own experiences and celebrations (Diwali and Christmas).
	· Learning about different occupations (Teacher, librarian, caretaker, shop assistant, conductor).
	· Exploring the outdoor environment (What can you see, hear, feel?). Collecting natural objects.
Physical Development	Experiment with different ways of moving and negotiating spaces successfully - (Rolling, crawling, walking, jumping, running, hopping, skipping, climbing).
	Form recognisable letters/develop correct letter formation.
	Developing fine/gross motor skills (Fine Motor Fridays).
	Using cutlery, paintbrushes and pencils correctly.
	Introduce children to balls games with teams, rules and targets.
