Please see below an overview of the main themes, knowledge and skills we will be covering this half term.

Enquiry	" How has Aston changed?"				
Question Class Texts	Titles: A Street Through Time, Beegu, Set up a City, Don't spill the milk Astreet Through Time BEEGU THE NILK!				
Reading	Domain: 1b – Identify/ explain key aspects of fiction and non-fiction texts, such as characters, events, title and information. In Reading, the children will be reading a range of phase 5 books to support their fluency when reading. They will look at and read harder to read and spell words. The children will also learn about alternative graphemes. Questioning will be based around recall from parts of the text and making predictions.				
Writing	This half term, children will identify the language and organisational features of informal and formal letters. They will then learn how to write an informal and formal letter. Children will revisit previous learning and focus on writing skills linked to conjunctions, descriptive language and emotive language.				
Maths	In Maths the children will be encouraged to count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals; count in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s. They will also revisit position and direction and learn about time.				
Science	This half term, the children will focus on animals. The children will explore how pets should be cared for, including what they eat and where they live. Children will learn how to identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores, and omnivores. They will group and sort a variety of common animals based on the foods they eat.				
History	During this term, children will learn about Birchfield's school history and the local area of Aston, both today				


	and in the past. Children will learn about the school's history, including the date of its construction and other important events. They will explore photographs, artefacts and firsthand accounts and will be encouraged to use common words and phrases related to the passage of time.
Design and Technology	The children will take part in making a variety of healthy foods. The children will have the opportunity to make a healthy fruit salad.
PE	Running- In this unit, children will explore running using different body parts and different techniques and begin to understand how to run efficiently. The children will also learn about ways to keep healthy linked to well -being.
RE	In R.E, they will be exploring the importance of being courageous and confident through class discussion and stories. The children will also revisit Sikhism, Islam and Christianity.
PSHE	The children will be exploring the question 'Who helps to keep us safe? 'They will learn about different people in the community that help them to keep safe, who can help us in different places/situations, how to respond safely to adults we don't know, the pants rule and what to do if we feel unsafe or worried.
Computing	During this half term, the children will learn about assigning data (images) with different labels in order to demonstrate how computers are able to group and present data.
Art	The children will be evaluation their pieces of work and also reflecting on adaptations that could be made.
Music	In music, the children will be learning about pitch, tempo and tone. The children will sing a range of songs in preparation for the Year 1 exhibition.

Politicians Joseph and Neville Chamberlain were from Birmingham. Neville Chamberlain was prime minister at the start of the Second World War.


The Bullring is a major shopping centre. It was originally a market area, perhaps dating back to 1166.


The University of
