Class Texts	The Three Little Pigs, In Every House on Every Street, Rosie's Walk, Martha Maps it Out, Stickman 
Literacy	• Writing words linked to a story/interests. • Phase 2 and Phase 3 phonics. • Joining in with songs and rhymes • Learning harder to read and spell words • Retelling a story and character descriptions
Maths	- Learning about repeated patterns - More and less within numbers to 8. - Learning about weight and length - Comparing quantities (Amount) - Number recognition

Communication and Language	We encourage the children to listen to stories and recall parts of a story (What is happening at the beginning, middle, end of the story?). The children will learn new vocabulary through a range of fiction and non-fiction books. Throughout the day we will encourage the children to answer how and why questions
Expressive Arts and Design	The children will have the opportunity to use a range of adhesives for a purpose. The children will be drawing and developing their sketching skills. Each child will make a collage and create pieces of work in the style of an artist (Eileen Agar)
Understanding of the World	Talking about own experiences and celebrations (Diwali and Christmas). · Operating simple equipment (Using an iPad) · Exploring the outdoor environment (What can you see, hear, feel?). Collecting natural objects. - Draw information from a simple map
Physical Development	Experiment with different ways of moving and negotiating spaces successfully - (Rolling, crawling, walking, jumping,

	running, hopping, skipping, climbing). Form recognisable letters/develop correct letter formation. Developing fine/gross motor skills Using cutlery, paintbrushes and pencils correctly. Introduce children to balls games with teams, rules and targets.
